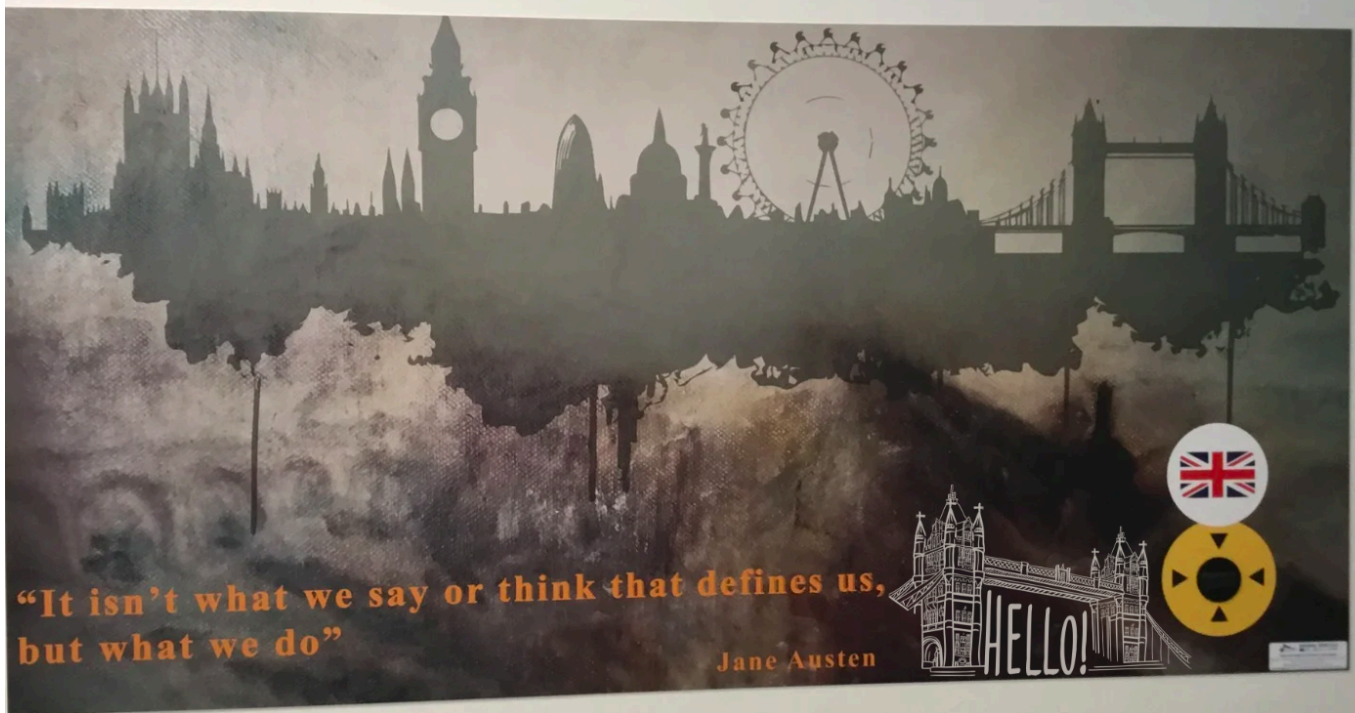
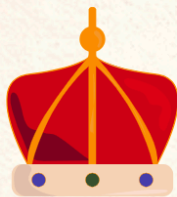

About Jane

Jane Austen (16 December 1775 – 18 July 1817) was an English novelist.

-She wrote many books of romantic fiction about the gentry.

Her works made her one of the most famous and beloved writers in English literature.

-She is one of the great masters of the English novel.

-Austen's works criticized sentimental novels in the late 18th century, and are part of the change to nineteenth-century realism. She wrote about typical people in everyday life. This gave the English novel its first distinctly modern character.

-Austen's stories are often comic, but they also show how women depended on marriage for social standing and economic security.

-Her works are also about moral problems

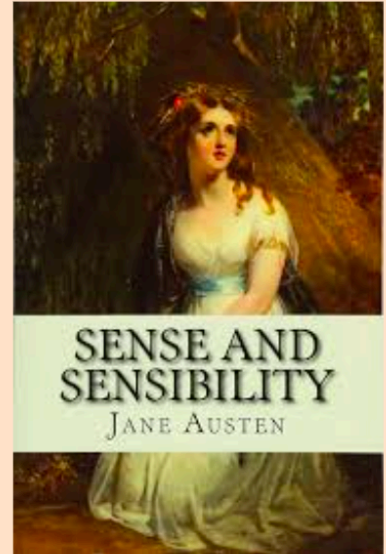

Sense and Sensibility

Sense and Sensibility is an 1811 sentimental novel by Jane Austen, which tells the story of the two Dashwood sisters, Elinor and Marianne. The two young women are the opposite of each other: Elinor, the eldest, embodies reason, while Marianne represents passion. After the death of their father, the sisters, along with their mother and younger sister, are forced to leave their home.

Elinore, leaving her father's house, remains fond of Edward, Fanny's brother. Arriving at the new accommodation, Marianne, while being courted by the rich colonel Brandon, falls in love with the young and autamt Willoughby.

Elinor and Marianne spend the winter in London, guests at Mrs Jennings's house.
